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Prescription for Community Health - More Little Lambs Partners

Little Lambs partners with 32 medical, social and educational agencies to help improve the health and well being of children age 0 to 3.

So where do the partners come from? Little Lambs is always in search of new partners. New applicants fill out a single page application to become a Little Lambs partner. If the application is approved, then the new partner gets as many Little Lambs vouchers as they need and they support Little Lambs both financially



and with volunteer time.

Today Little Lambs

partners with 11 physician groups, 6 First

Step providers, 4 transitional housing facilities, 2 shelters, 2 EVSC programs, 2 providers of in-home parenting aid, the health department, a nutrition program, Catholic Charities, an English as a second

language program and the new Fatherhood Initiative through the Vanderburgh Co. Grassroots Coalition.

There is still a need for more partners though. While Little Lambs works with three great OB/GYN Groups, Welborn OB/GYN, Dr. Thomas Hastetter and Drs. Paul and Mark Morrison, getting prenatal care for even more of our expectant moms is critical for our community's health.

Time to round up the sheep again!

It is once again Little Lambs Shepherd's Flock Time. With an extra day of operations each week, the herd has grown significantly and we need your help to corral these little fellers. While we brought in over 270 packages of diapers during the blockbuster Mother's Day Diaper Drive, we gave out over 190 in



May alone.

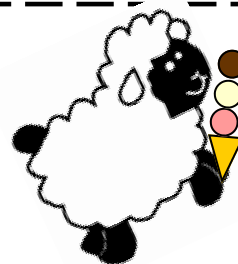
